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Course Description

This introductory three-day course teaches the Army's established methodology for Business Process Reengineering. This approach uses a holistic view to rethink and redesign business processes to achieve new and elevated mission outcomes. Attendees will participate in interactive learning and gain experience using tools and techniques needed to become BPR practitioners.

Course Goals

Students who successfully complete this course will gain:

- Fluency with the basic BPR terms and principles
- Familiarity with the value garnered from BPR
- Knowledge of the requirements to conduct BPR
- Understanding of BPR methodology phases
- Ability to utilize BPR tools, templates, and best practices

Required Texts, Materials, or Equipment

- A handout is provided on the first day of class which contains BPR overview information, directions for the class exercises, and information about the Army scenario used in class.
- Students will be provided with the training slides in advance of the course and can print them for notetaking purposes, if they so choose.
- Students are not required to bring any additional materials to class.
- Use of laptops and electronic devices is discouraged during class hours.


